Phase 1: Problem statement, intended impact, outcomes

Target Area: Access to Careers

Problem

A lack of access to high-potential careers for those living within low income, urban communities contributes negatively to a widening socio-economic gap.

IREM Foundation Impact

Increased entry into high potential real estate management career paths by people living within economically disadvantaged, urban areas throughout North America over the next 10 years.

Outcomes

- 1. Increased adoption of DEI hiring practices by employers in real estate management industry.
- 2. Increased participation in industry education/training, and job fairs by individuals ages 16-26 living in economically disadvantaged communities.
- 3. Increased awareness of the long-term potential of real estate management careers and accessible entry points by individuals ages 16 26 living in economically disadvantaged communities.

Target Area: Sustainability in the Built Environment

Problem

Commercial and residential real estate generate a significant percent of greenhouse gas emissions.

IREM Foundation Impact

Increased adoption of green initiatives within commercial real estate over the next 10 years.

Outcomes

- 1. Increased participation in sustainability education/training among employees of real estate management companies.
- 2. Increased adoption of sustainability-focused resources and programs in commercial real estate.
